

About John: John Battles is a field scientist engaged in long-term research of temperate forest ecosystems. His goal is to understand how and why forests change. Towards this end, his research seeks to understand the dynamic response of forest communities to disturbances and perturbations such as air pollution, invasive species, forest management, river regulation, and fire. He is the lead investigator of the Sierra Nevada Adaptive Management Project and a co-investigator of the Hubbard Brook Ecosystem Study. He previously served as co-director of the UC Berkeley's Center for Forestry where he provided oversight of the management of UC's research forests for more than a decade. He currently serves as Chair of the Division of Ecosystem Sciences at UC Berkeley.
