<u>ACTIVITY #3, Part 1</u>: Prioritize Adaptation Strategies and Actions from Across Habitats, Species Groups, and Species

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP WORK ON GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. Identify a volunteer facilitator, a volunteer to take notes for the group, a volunteer to report back to the full group, and a timekeeper. This worksheet is for your personal use in taking notes.
- 2. Review the question and considerations below and then work through them as a group. You will have **about 75 minutes** for discussion.
- 3. At the end, the volunteer reporter should be prepared to share highlights of discussion about each question with the full group. Please use the flip charts to write down priorites for the report-back. Each reporter will have **10 minutes** when they present to the full group. After reports we will then have a discussion as a full group.

Question to answer as a group:

- 1. Looking at your collection of <u>adaptation strategies and actions</u>, consider the following question: What are the top strategies and actions for a given group (i.e., upland, wetland, riverine/riparian, desert)? Use the six considerations evaluated for each action to help you prioritize. For example, priority strategies and actions might be those with high feasibility and effectiveness that reduce multiple stressors. Also, be sure to look at the range of strategies and actions for habitats, species groups, and species within your group (e.g., upland) in order to identify those strategies and actions that benefit multiple resources.
- 2. Generate a short prioritization list of proposed strategies and actions for habitats, species groups, and species.
