# **ACTIVITY #3, Part 2: Landscape-Scale Strategies**

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP WORK ON GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. Identify a volunteer facilitator, a volunteer to take notes for the group, a volunteer to report back to the full group, and a timekeeper. This worksheet is for your personal use in taking notes.
- 2. Review the question and considerations below and then work through them as a group. You will have about 30-35 minutes for discussion.
- 3. At the end, the volunteer reporter should be prepared to share highlights of discussion about each question with the full group. Please use the flip charts to write down priorites for the report-back. Each reporter will have 4-5 minutes when they present to the full group. After reports we will then have a ~20 minute discussion as a full group.

## Question to answer as a group:

- Considering the previous large-group discussion on priority adaptation strategies and actions, generate 1-2 landscape-scale strategies that cross resources (i.e., sub-habitats, species groups, species), considering not just resources within your group (i.e., desert, upland, wetland, riparian) but resources within other groups.
- 2. Review CVLCP project objectives in order to line up landscape-scale strategies with overall project goals:
  - Conserve resilient and adaptable ecosystems that sustain future Central Valley biodiversity.
  - Promote landscape-scale connectivity and ecological and physical processes that function within current and future ranges of variability to support a diverse and thriving
  - Reduce the impacts of climate change and other co-occurring stressors to Central Valley ecosystems.
